Jesus said "If you love me you will keep my commandments: unless I wash you, you have no part of me." Let us confess to Almighty God our sins against his love and ask him to cleanse us.

Father eternal, giver of light and grace, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour, in what we have thought, in what we have said and done,  
**Lord have mercy upon us:**

Through ignorance, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault, we have wounded your love, and marred your image in us:

**Christ have mercy upon us:**

We are sorry and ashamed and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ who died for us, forgive us all that is past and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light.

**Lord have mercy upon us.**

Almighty God, who forgives all that truly repent have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins; confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Collects
